If you've worked on audiobooks before, some of this might feel familiar, but I've included it in case my methods differ from what you're used to.

Process Overview

Here is a bare-bones overview of the Audiobook creation process. I will create a shared Google Drive folder where I will upload audio files and forms. The following pages have more details on each step, you can click on the topic to jump to that page.

Manuscript & Notes

You will need to supply a final, edited full manuscript of the book in PDF or Microsoft Word format.

- ♦ If I find a small obvious error in the book, I will mark it on the manuscript and narrate the correction.
- ♦ Any questionable edits, I will ask you before I change and narrate.

Character Notes: I will supply an optional "Character Description Form" through google drive. This form is an easy, organized way for you to provide any specific performance and characteristic notes for the characters in the book/series.

*I will need to know if there are any minor characters that will play a larger role in future books. This will affect the way they are voiced.

- Character Notes on Form:
 - Dream Casting
 - Animal Essence
 - Does this character show up in future books in the series?
 - Age
 - Accent
 - Adjectives
 - Additional info I should know



Manuscript Prepping

I read through the entire book, annotating along the way: highlighting and color-coding dialogue, researching pronunciations, adding performance notes, etc.

Post read-through communication:
 Once the initial read-through is complete, I will send any questions, edits, or pronunciation inquiries about the book (typically in email).

Pronunciation guide: (usually for fantasy) If you have one, great, please attach to the google drive folder I create. If not, I will send a list of words that I need clarification on. You can send me pronunciations a few ways:

 Detailed, phonetic spelling sheet with accented syllables and, if available, rhyming words.

 Send voice notes via text or WhatsApp, clearly annunciating each word.

 Use "Voice Recorder" on PC or "Voice Memos" on Mac and email audio files with words clearly annunciated.

Extended Sample

Once prepping is complete, we move on to record a sample (longer than the audition) for your approval.

- ♦ Misconceptions:
 - It must be 15 minutes. Wrong! Most times I record segments longer than 15 minutes. The most important thing is that you have a decent sample to hear the performance, pacing, tone, and several characters.
 - It must be the *first* 15 minutes of the book. Wrong! It can be from any part of the book.
 - It must be consecutive. Wrong! You can pick multiple scenes or chapters from different part of the book.
- ♦ IMPORTANT!: This step is critical. This will be the last time you will be able to give creative input about performance (line readings, voice changes, etc). This is also written into most contracts. Once we have passed this part of the process, the only "pick-ups" (edits) allowed are technical issues and reading errors.
- ♦ 3 sample options:
 - Pick an important scene that represents the level of emotion you are expecting.
 - Pick a section that includes the most main characters in the series. If there are characters you want to hear, but are not provided in the sample, I can provide "character voice demos" for those characters upon request.
 - The first 15 minutes of the book.
- Once approved, the contract officially becomes locked in (before this point, the contract can be nulled for any reason), and the next step begins. Recording!



Recording!

At this point, you probably won't hear from me much as I have left this world and entered the one of your book. I pride myself on meeting deadlines, however, sometimes life happens. I will always communicate with you if issues arise.



Proofing/Editing/Mastering!

Once recording is complete, the entire audiobook must be reviewed for "pick-ups". These are technical glitches (chair squeaks, knocks, dog barks), mispronunciations, and wrong text narrated Afterward, I go back and re-record these lines.

I have two ways of handling this part of the process and it all depends on YOU!

- Review all files once I'm fully finished.
- Listen as I record and request pick-ups along the way. This speeds up the process because can immediately record pick-ups and send the files off for mastering.
- If you prefer to remain hands-off, I can send the files to my engineer for proofing, editing, and mastering. This adds an additional \$10 PFH to my rate as my engineer costs increase for the "proofing".

Once the Pick-ups are complete, my engineer edits the audio, corrects spacing, and masters all files to meet the technical sound standards.

- ♦ I then upload all mastered files to platform fo your final approval. I highly encourage a full listen through of the final files to make sure nothing "slipped through the cracks". These would be technical errors only, no performance notes.
- Most contracts allow for 7 days to do a final listen-through and either approve or return for edits (technical only).
- Once you approve the final audio, you will hit "I approve" and we move on to the next step, Payment.



Payment

- I will invoice you (usually) the same day that I upload the mastered files to ACX (or respectable platform).
 - PFH payments are handled outside of the platforms.
 - PayPal, Venmo, or card (all info is found on the invoice)
 - Platforms only handle royalty payments.
- Once you have approved the audio files on the platform and sent payment, I will click the "I have received payment" button on the platform so the files will then move to the final stage.

Publication (Quality Assurance)

- ♦ ACX takes 10-14 business days to approve an audiobook before it's released for listening.
- ♦ Once that happens, CONGRATS! You have successfully published an audiobook. Now comes the "hard" part...



Marketing

- ♦ Promo Codes
 - ACX and Findaway Voices offer promo codes that you can hand out to promote the book and gain reviews. I know of some authors that have used these in giveaways on social media (Facebook, Reddit, etc).
- 🗘 Social Media
 - Audiobook release parties
 - Sound Clips posts (I'd be happy to record some "teasers" that you can use. Just let me know the chapter, page, and paragraph numbers)
 - Don't forget to change all your promotional material for your book to include "Paperback, EBook, AND AUDIO"
 - Be cautious of bookstagrammers and booktokers reaching out to you via DM to promote your book. Some are scams.
- Promotional Websites (Book Tours): These are companies that use book bloggers and bookstagrammers to promote your book using their online presence. There are typically different "packages" available.
 - R&R Book Tours
 - Meet the Main Characters
- Marketing Audiobooks Wide is a Facebook page that has loads more information about marketing.
